PROGRAM ADMISSION CRITERIA

- Grade point average is evaluated using transcript information. There is no minimum grade point average required; however, if below 2.75, there will not be points awarded in this category
- Two Teacher Recommendations (one from your current ELA teacher and one from another core teacher is preferred)
- PSAT 8/9 score results – for most students currently in a SCUSD site, this will be from the October 10th administration
- Extra-Curricular participation – sports, service organizations, musical involvement, and others

ACADEMIC POLICY – Any student who has a grade point average below 2.0 in any semester, or a cumulative grade point average below 2.5 will be immediately placed on academic probation. While on probation, if a student has a semester grade point average below 2.5, that student may be involuntarily dis-enrolled from West Campus High School.
